






Dear Parents and Carers,

The Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales have designated 2020 as 'The God Who Speaks': A Year of the Word to celebrate the 10th anniversary of *Verbum Domini* – Pope Benedict XVI's Apostolic Exhortation on 'The Word of the Lord', and the 1600th anniversary of death of St Jerome, who translated the Bible into Latin.

At St Clare's we have dedicated this year to be 'Our Year of the Word'. Throughout the year we shall be seeking opportunities to celebrate, live and share God's word with our children, our parish and our school community. One of the first things we are asking our children to research about is to develop their knowledge of Matthew's gospel. EARLY YEARS

This half term we have been enjoying learning all about People Who Help Us. We have looked at doctors, police officers and life-guards. Children have also enjoyed taking part in the Rainbow Challenge; completing different challenges and collecting a stick. As part of our PE, we have been learning new rhymes and songs and associated actions. We are getting extremely good at building and have loved working with lego, straws and connectors and big building blocks. Our teachers are all really proud of the amazing creations we have come up with!

In RE we have been learning all about Simeon and Anna and Jesus' presentation at the Temple. We even helped teach the other classes in our key stage assembly on Tuesday by acting the story out for them. We are enjoying exploring the wide array of books written by our Julia Donaldson and have also enjoyed sharing some of our favourite stories with Everywhere Bear who is taking it in turns to come home with someone each night, snuggle up and read with us.

YEAR 1

IS IT A BIRD? IS IT A PLANE? NO WE THINK IT WAS AN ALIEN!

Earlier this term Year one explored a crash site in the school garden. The children carried out an investigation and they found lots of metal screws and pipes and a smashed glass dome. The site was covered in sparkling moon dust and the garden gate was dripping with glowing yellow slime. The children wrote crash reports and concluded that it must have been an alien spaceship!

Year one have had lots of fun in science being sense detectives in our school outdoor area. The children went on a senses Scavenger Hunt to see if they could find and describe a list of objects using their senses of sight, smell, sound and touch. They enjoyed listening to nature and finding sweet smelling plants and flowers. They found lots of rough and smooth natural objects but unfortunately no treasure!

YEAR 2

Year 2 have been really enjoying the new topic on Famous Faces. We have been learning about Neil Armstrong and comparing his experiences with Tim Peake. In Art we have been looking at pointillist painting and the work of Georges Seurat. The children really enjoyed producing pointillist pictures. In science we have been talking about food chains. We have made mobiles representing different chains. There were some fascinating conversations about who eats who! Thank you for supporting the children with their homework. There are some fabulous rockets coming in.

YEAR 3

Year 3 have been enjoying their Famous Faces topic - we have loved learning about the life of Grace Darling. In Maths we have been learning about multiplication and division with remainders. We are very lucky to have a student teacher with us this term and we are all showing a great commitment to our work. In art we are looking at the work of the artist Lowry and we will be using his art work to inspire us. In science we are learning about famous scientists eg Marie Curie, who have impacted our world with their discoveries. We continue to celebrate the wonderful homework that the children of Year 3 produce and their model making is amazing!

Our author this term is Roald Dahl and we are currently enjoying reading 'The Witches.'

YEAR 4

Year 4 have made an excellent start to this half tern, completing lots of lovely work about Grace Darling and her heroic rescues. Pupils have produced some amazing writing using Talk for Writing to produce their own newspaper reports. Mr Swinnerton has been blown away by the quality of work, particularly our amazing handwriting which hasn't gone unnoticed by Mrs Eddies! In Science, we have had a blast conducting experiments with eggs, we have had an eye opening time as we looked at which drinks are the worst for our teeth—the results were rather unexpected!

Mrs Shipley, who listens to the children read each week, also gave us a lovely talk on her role within the local church community. She told us all about her work in the parish and even brought in some hosts to allow us to have a practice at receiving holy communion. Year 4 behaved extremely respectfully and gained a great deal from the experience.

YEAR 5

Year 5 Mini-Vinnies have been very successful in raising money for Francis Hannaway's missionary work in the Congo. They have raised over £150 through holding weekly tuck shops. Thank you to all parents/carers for their generosity and to Mrs Manders for her time and effort in providing stock and organising the children. This is an important cause and is part of Year 5's contribution to the Year of the Word in our school. Further to this, Year 5 studied the baptism of Jesus as part of the school's journey through Matthew's Gospel . They studied the scripture before producing some stunning pieces of artwork. They then presented this to the other children in a whole school assembly.

YEAR 6

On Tuesday, we held a SATS meeting for parents to discuss the arrangements of SATS week (w/c 11th May 2020). Homework books will be distributed before half term following payment of £10 via Parentpay. If any parents were unable to attend the meeting, please feel free to catch Miss Beamson, otherwise she will update parents during their Parents Evening appointment. Children are working extremely hard in their practice papers and are showing a fantastic attitude towards their learning. This week, we have been writing a persuasive letter to the South African Government to ask them to release Nelson Mandela after being sentenced to life in prison following his attempts to overthrow the Government.
